BASKET STUFFERS



These plants are great for filling in hanging baskets or planters. Choose from Creeping Jenny; Spikes' Spider Plant; Persian Shield; Coleus; Dwarf Zinnias; Geraniums -

red, pink, orange/red, mauve, white (small pots).

AMARANTH

(Love Lies Bleeding)



This unusual annual grows 2 to 8 feet tall and 1 to 3 feet wide. Well-drained loamy soil is best but it will do well in almost any soil. It does need full sun.

BEGONIA



Begonias never fall out of favour as a bedding or potted plant with blooms all summer long. Put them in full sun and water well. Mixed colours.

COLEUS



This classic houseplant can live outdoors for the summer in pots or beds and then, if you wish, be brought in for fall. The brightly coloured foliage in bold patterns; the flowers are formed on small spikes.

They like partial shade, and need to be kept well-watered.

DAHLIA



Plan to grow your dahlias in a spot where they'll receive full sun and be sure the soil is very well draining. Tubers that sit in wet soil

tend to become mushy and rot, and dahlias are no exception. They are perennial if you dig the tubers out in fall and over winter them in a cool basement.

Small Dahlia: Blooms 3 - 4", plant 12 - 20"

Colours: rust, red, yellow

DIANTHUS



Dianthus (also called *Sweet William* or *Pinks*) is known for its lovely scent and bright colour.

Small, usually 6 to 18 inches tall. Full sun, part-shade but need a minimum of six hours of sun daily.

ANNUAL but will self-seed.

GERANIUM



Geraniums are everybody's favourite for bedding and container planning. Plant in full sun and keep them well watered.

GRASS SPIKES



We have a small number of grass spikes, popular for placing in the middle of a basket or at the back of a bed.

MARIGOLD



Marigold: These are the popular favourites that brighten any garden all summer long. They grow 8 inches to one foot in height. Full sun. Can tolerate poor soil.

African Marigold: This tall, branching marigold variety has loads of ruffled petticoat flowers in shimmering gold. They are a true scene-stealer. Easy to grow, they bloom non-stop from summer to frost. Full sun. Can tolerate poor soil.

NICOTANIA



Flowering tobacco plants produce fuzzy, sticky foliage and flower stalks with nodding trumpet-shaped flowers. Each flower has five petals that flare at the end.

The flower colors complement one another so that you can plant a mix for an attractive large Nicotiana bed. Red and white.

Grows 3 to 5 feet in height. Plant 18" apart. Attracts hummingbirds and bees. Full sun – part shade. Can tolerate poor soil.

PANSY



Pansies are a true classic summer annual flower in Ontario. Be sure to plant them in a

bed or a pot that's in full sun, and keep them well watered but not wet.

Also, pull off the finished blooms to encourage new ones to develop. We are offering mixed colours.

PETUNIA



Excellent for hanging baskets and flower beds. Petunias are tolerant of heat so you don't have to water them regularly.

A thorough watering once a week should be sufficient (unless there are prolonged periods of drought in your area). The spreading types and those in containers require more frequent watering though.

Fertilize your plants monthly to ensure good growth. Double-flowered cultivars like a biweekly dose of fertilizer. Remove dead flowers to prolong blooming. Full sun.

PERSIAN SHIELD



This striking plant, a member of the *Acanthaceae* family, is an annual grown for its thick colourful foliage. At some point, it produces small white flowers on long stamens.

Persian Shield can be planted outdoors or raised in hanging baskets after all danger of frost is past.

If you wish, come the late summer, you can take cuttings and use them to generate houseplants for the winter.

Colours: Red and green foliage.

SNAPDRAGON



The flowers start blooming at the bottom of the stalk and work their way up, making for a long period of bloom. Although Snapdragons tend to stop blooming in the heat of mid-summer, if you keep them watered they will perk up and carry your garden through the fall. Mature plant can grow to one foot. Full sun to partial shade.

SPIDER PLANT



This is the popular indoor/outdoor plant with long green leaves with white stripes. "Baby" plants develop at the sides over time. Ours are already planted in hanging baskets. You can over-winter them in your home and place outdoors again next year.

ZINNIA



Old-fashioned Zinnias provide bright, solitary, daisy-like flower heads on a single, erect stem. This makes them great for use as a cutting flower or as food for butterflies. Will grow to 24 -36" Full sun.

Mixed colours. Plants are 6" – 8".

VEGETABLES

PEPPERS



Everyone loves peppers picked fresh from the

garden. Choose from a limited selection of Sweet Green; Hot Red, Portugal and Scotch Bonnet peppers.

TOMATO, Cherry



Who doesn't love homegrown tomatoes? Cherry tomatoes are great for salads and snacking.

TOMATO, Beefsteak



Beefsteak tomatoes are great for topping burgers, slicing and more.

ZUCCHINI



Easy to grow, very productive, lots of cooking possibilities – what’s not to like about Zucchini? These well-started plants just need a rich soil and sunny spot and regular watering. Limited quantities!

PERENNIALS

BLACK EYED SUSAN



Members of the sunflower family, the “black eye” is named for the dark, brown-purple centers of its daisy-like flower heads. The plants can grow to over 3 feet tall, with leaves of 6 inches, stalks over 8 inches long and flower diameter of 2 to 3 inches.

Butterflies, bees, and a variety of insects are attracted to the flowers for the nectar. As they drink the nectar, they move pollen from one

plant to another, causing it to grow fruits and seeds that can move about easily with the wind.

These plants bloom from June to October. Note that they can be territorial in that they tend to squash out other flowers growing near them.

Full sun, can tolerate poor soil.

DAY LILY



If there's a "sure bet" perennial, it must be the daylily. They tolerate a wide variety of soil conditions, are not troubled by diseases or pests, and bloom faithfully for years with virtually no attention. Daylilies flower best when planted in full sun (6 hours/day), on moist, yet well-drained soil.

The *Stella D'Oro* variety, a short kind of day lily, reblooms all season.

Mixed colours and patterns including tall Double Orange; Apricot with ruffled edge, compact; White; Old-fashioned Orange; Stella D'Oro

FORGET-ME-NOT



Forget-Me-Nots are a wildflower native to North America. They make a great groundcover, but will likely need some work to keep them in check, depending on where you plant them.

They feature small, bright blue flowers with tiny yellow centres. They do best in damp, shady areas.

HOSTA



Plant hostas in evenly moist, humus-rich soil in light to full shade. Hostas are tough, versatile, and adaptable. Filtered sun is best for the colorful varieties to reach their full potential, especially gold and blue forms. The green-leaved varieties are the most shade tolerant.

Mixed types: Solid green; green with white edge; green with yellow edging.

IRIS



Irises are a classic flower for the Canadian perennial bed. They bloom in June with large, showy blossoms.

They prefer a dry-ish soil but don't plant them too deeply. Irises grow on tubers, and need to have some sun touch the tops of the tuber. They will reward you with years after year of blooms.

Colours: Dark Blue (bearded); Dark Blue (dwarf); Mauve; Light mauve with yellow (tall);

LADY'S MANTLE



Easily grown in average, medium moisture, well-drained soils in full sun to part shade, but tolerates close to full shade. Performs well in moist garden areas. Freely self-seeds.

Lady's Mantle, is a clumping perennial which typically forms a base foliage mound (6-12" tall) of long-stalked, scallop-edged, light green leaves. Tiny, star-shaped, chartreuse flowers appear in loose, spreading clusters in late spring to early summer.

The tendency of plant leaves to retain moisture beads after a rain is considered to be a unique and attractive ornamental feature.

LAMB'S EAR



This easy-care perennial has velvety-soft and woolly evergreen leaves that are silvery-grey. The foliage is also similar in shape to a real lamb's ear, hence its name. If left to bloom in summer, Lamb's Ear will produce spikes of pink to purple coloured flowers.

Grow this plan in full sun or partial shade. Although Lamb's Ear can tolerate the poorest of soils, it should always be well drained, as the plant dislikes overly moist soil. This is especially true of shady areas. PERENNIAL

LAMIUM



Lamium plants are a perfect deer-resistant groundcover to brighten a partly sunny to semi-shady spot.

Vigorous without being invasive, Lamium produce dainty snapdragon-like flowers in colors from white, to pink to purple.

Attractive two-toned foliage provides interest even when the flowers are not in bloom. Plant them in the garden or in pots.

LILY OF THE VALLEY



This classic ground cover loves a shady or semi-shady spot. It reliably sends up small, oval leaves and dainty white flowers.

MOONDROPS



This plant has many names – they're also known as *Sun Drops* and *Evening Primrose*. The lovely yellow flowers appear in spring / summer; foliage turns bright red in fall.

Price: \$5/pot

PEONY



These long-lived perennials are the Queen of the early summer garden. They reliably produce large showy blooms every July, often for decades. They do best in full sun.

When planting, take care not to plant them too deep. There is an “eye” on the top of the root that needs to be exposed to the sun.

Colour: Pink

PERIWINKLE



Periwinkle (Creeping Myrtle) is a short, very hard groundcover with dark green leaves and bright blue blooms in spring. Prefers partial

shade but can take some sun. Be prepared to keep it in check.

PHLOX



Phlox are perennials and a favorite choice— from ground cover blooming in early spring to the tall phlox blooming in mid- to late summer.

Phlox prefer rich, evenly-moist, well-draining soil. Plant 18” apart. Will bush out and grow to 24”. Remember to remove the dead/faded flowers so that your plants can re-bloom.

Full sun to part sun.

Colours: Pink; Lilac; White
